Division Objectives:

- Accurately respond to legislative audit questions and findings.
- Update legacy information technology systems and sustain existing systems.
- Recruit, retain and compensate a qualified workforce.
- Keep the livestock industry and public informed of industry programs and issues through timely and accurate public information and education.
- Assist divisions in procuring and managing cooperative agreements.
- Represent the department and fiscal programs to the executive and legislative offices.
- Provide the department with workable and efficient information technology systems.
- Effectively staff the Board of Milk Control and the Livestock Loss Board (LLB).

Measurements:

- The Executive Officer and Board will evaluate the quality of budget information based upon observation at board and legislative meetings.
- Audit findings will be immediately addressed with the goal of not repeating.
- Turnover problems are mitigated and held to a minimum.
- Federal funding is achieved and procedures are met to ensure continued funding.
- Public information is timely and accurate and approved by the Executive Officer.
- Monthly and final financial reports are complete and timely.
- Fiscal information presented to the Board and Legislature is concise and understandable.
- Resolve information technology software problems in a timely manner and successfully the dynamics of information technology.
- Boards are represented with quality data, professionalism, neutrality and sensitivity to livestock industry issues.
