

Report of the Secretary of the Board of Stock Commissioners

Hon. S. V. Stewart, Governor.

Sir:

The past year has undoubtedly been the busiest year in the history of this office. Since the appointment of the present Board and the legislative enactments of 1911, practically the entire method of the office has been changed. A detailed account of the work of the office is unnecessary and uninteresting.

The number of cattle shipped from the state of Montana during 1912 totals 188,675. The estimated number of horses, is about 25,000. This is a shortage of about 17,000 head of cattle, as compared with the year 1911. I believe the actual shortage is greater than the figures show. This shortage of cattle is considerably less than was expected. It had been predicted that the shortage would reach 40,000. These figures only go to prove that the stock industry is still very large in Montana, and although we expect a less number to be shipped for the next few years, we believe that eventually, the state of Montana will produce more cattle than it ever has. A particularly noticeable feature of the shipments out of the state, is the decrease in the number of calves and young stock shipped; for instance, there were 4,798 calves shipped from Montana to the Chicago markets in 1911; in 1912, there were 1,052. This proves that the stockmen of Montana are not shipping their young or breeding stuff. It is true that a number of the large herds have been reduced and some have been closed out. This, of course, has been caused by the influx of settlers and, while certain districts have been appropriated by the settlers, there is still much range in the state of Montana; in fact, more range than we have cattle for. During the past year, there has been at least 25,000 head of southern cattle shipped into Montana for range purposes. If we did not have the range to accommodate these cattle they could not be shipped in. We are merely in the midst of re-adjustment; smaller herds and more of them.

Under the re-recording law passed the 1911 legislature, there have been 19,232 brands re-recorded. Besides this, we have issued 4,922 new brands, which number includes the old brands which have been adopted by new owners, up to date. The re-recording law has proven popular among the stockmen and I believe will do much towards simplifying the brand records. So far, it has proven all that was expected of it.

The Board maintains 18 paid inspectors within the state of Montana, each inspector having jurisdiction over a certain district. Besides these paid inspectors, we have a number who are holding commissions without pay or are being paid by local stock associations. We have the inspectors so distributed about the state that they are within easy reach of any shipping point. There has been no complaint from the railroads or stockmen, on account of being unable to reach an inspector when shipping. The railroads have assisted us in enforcing the regulations, pertaining to inspection before shipment and have accepted no shipments of cattle or horses until the inspection certificate was filed with the agent. I wish to congratulate the railroads on their strict observance of this law and although we had some difficulty in getting them to accept it, they have done so and followed the law to the letter.

During the past year this board, in conjunction with a committee appointed by the Montana Stock Growers Association, has been endeavoring to get the rate on livestock between stations within the state reduced and also come to some understanding on a uniform rate over all roads. We are desirous of obtaining a uniform car mile rate over all roads, to be based upon the present ten car rate per hundred miles. This matter has been taken up by the railroad commission and we hope for some definite action in the near future.

The 1911 legislature passed a bounty law. The merits of the law, I do not care to discuss. I do, however, wish to make a suggestion to the stockmen of the state concerning the operation of this law. The law provides for the appointment of bounty inspectors in the counties. These bounty inspectors are to be appointed by the bounty commission of the county and the bounty commission in turn is appointed by the judge of the district. The bounty commission is supposed to be composed of stockmen. I do not believe that this provision of the law is properly carried out and I believe that the stockmen of the state would save themselves a great deal of money if they would take more interest in the appointment of bounty commissioners and bounty inspectors. In a great many cases the bounty inspectors are not qualified for the position or are in a business that makes them lenient with the requirements of the law. To be more explicit, the bounty inspectors at the county seats are usually the janitors of some clerk in the court house. If all the provisions of the bounty law were strictly observed, it would eliminate a great deal of the fraud in connection with the bounties.

I recommend to the present legislature that they pass laws as follows, giving my reasons for the same:

"That a law be passed requiring the inspection of cattle, when moved from one county to another for any purpose other than range or pasturing, and to be exempt in this case, only when the stock cross the county line for their usual pasturage."

The statutes already require the inspection of horses under these conditions. Why cattle were not included, I cannot understand. The necessity of this law is obvious, for the following reasons: There is, in the present day, a great deal of trading in cattle. Bunches are moved back and forth over the state as a result of the sales.

There being no law requiring inspection for brands, stockmen in the vicinity of the shipment have no assurance that all the cattle in the shipment rightfully belong there.

Cities in Montana are becoming quite a factor in the consumption of beef. Representatives of local slaughter houses buy cattle in all parts of the state and ship them direct to the slaughter houses without inspection. Here, again, the stockman has not the proper protection.

We have plenty of inspectors over the state to look after these shipments, but it is seldom they know of such shipments and the law permits the railroads to accept such shipments without inspection.

"That a law be enacted by the legislature, defining strays and providing for the sale of same."

Under the present laws of the State of Montana, there is no definition of an estray and there is no law providing for the handling of such an animal within the state. There is a statute

providing for the shipment of strays to market points, such as Chicago, etc., where this Board maintains inspectors. We are therefore, enabled to handle strays by such shipments.

In cases, however, when strays are found beyond the reach of the roundups and in the densely settled part of Montana, it is nearly impossible to arrange for shipment of such strays to the markets. The result is that this animal lives on the open range or through charity, some stockman provides winter feed for him. There is no way, however, for the stockman to gain any title to the animal; result being, that the animal either dies of old age or is appropriated without authority. The result of this is that the owner never receives any returns for the animal nor does the state, in case the owner cannot be located. Such animals are the prey of stock rustlers.

There are many difficulties in passing a law providing for the sale of strays, and the legislature should be very careful that the law is so safeguarded that the sale of strays will not be abused. There is much argument against the sale of any stray.

"That the legislature provide for annual passes, over the railroads for stock inspectors within the state."

It has cost this Board nearly \$3,000.00 during the past year to provide its inspectors with mileage. It seems to me particularly fitting that stock inspectors should receive passes, as their business really facilitates the operation of the railroads.

All cattle and horses must be inspected before shipment and by far the greater amount of travel done by the inspectors, is to reach shipping points where stock is being held for inspection. It seems unjust that the state should pay the railroads for transporting an inspector when his presence is absolutely necessary to the railroad's business. I am not asking that this office receive a pass, nor any of the members of the Board of Stock Commissioners. I do believe, however, that passes should be accepted for the stock inspectors.

This Board has asked for an appropriation of \$25,000 per year for the two coming fiscal years. This is \$5,000.00 in excess of the appropriation during the past two fiscal years. The particular reason I am asking for this increase, is to be financially able to publish a brand book, containing all the recorded brands in the state of Montana. No such brand book has ever been published and it would be a great boon to all the stockmen in the state.

The Langhorne case has occupied the attention of not only the stockman in the state but a great many of its citizens. The 1911 legislature appointed a committee, known as the Investigating Committee, to investigate the Langhorne shortage and they were also given the power, and money appropriated for the purpose, of prosecuting any persons criminally connected with the Langhorne shortage. There has been no prosecution during the past two years for reasons best known to the Investigating Committee. They have, however, issued a report which has been published in the papers of the state, and which report was entirely financial, giving in detail, the amount of the embezzlement by Langhorne and designating the amounts the owners of which could be located. Copies of this report can no doubt be had. Embodied in it, however, are some points on which the Investigating Committee did not have proper information, or neglected to mention facts that should have been given space. I have always remained passive in this matter and willing to let events take their course. At this time, however, in justice to myself and in justice to the members of the old board. I wish to call your attention to these facts.

I believe it would be possible to get more information on the Lander shortage, that would prove this shortage to be much less than is quoted by the Investigating Committee. The \$2,000.00 unaccounted for at the time Mr. W. G. Preuitt succeeded Mr. Harrison, is another matter that would justify further investigation. This amount should not be charged to Mr. Preuitt until every effort has been made to discover what use has been made of this money. Is does not seem likely that a man would appropriate \$2,000.00 at the moment of assuming office.

The Investigating Committee also censures the old Board of Stock Commissioners because of its carelessness in not auditing the books of the Board. The members of the Board of Stock Commissioners are not accountants. Each and every one of the checks forged and embezzled by Langhorne, have the blue pencil pass mark of the State Bank Examiner of Montana. The books of the Board were annually examined by the Bank Examiner and they bear the certified declaration of the Examiner, that they have been examined and found correct. Under these circumstances, is it just to presume that the Board of Stock Commissioners who met once a year would have been able to discover a shortage which had eluded the examination of the State Bank Examiner.

The report of the Investigating Committee makes no mention whatever of any money or property recovered from Langhorne. It is a fact the \$2,800.00 in money and a house valued at \$5,000.00 were recovered. The money was turned over to me as secretary and the house was turned over to the State Treasurer as trustee. The recovery of this money and property is due entirely to the efforts of Mr. C. J. McNamara, who was then a member of the Board, and myself. The fact that money was recovered should have been mentioned in the report. If the secretaries are to be held for the shortage which occurred under their administrations, I believe they should also be credited with the amount recovered.

Again, the committee makes no mention of the fact that there is practically \$1,500.00 in the banks at Helena, which is about all accounted for by checks that were issued and stolen by Langhorne but not presented for payment. This amount should certainly be credited against the embezzlement of Langhorne. I believe that I can show the committee that the amount they have charged against my administration is more than the actual money taken by Langhorne, and if the amount which we recovered is credited to my administration, there will be practically \$4,000.00 in excess of the amount taken while he worked under me. The committee also states in its report that less than \$3,100.00 which was stolen by Langhorne belonged to actual owners. This \$3,100.00 covers the whole period since 1908. The balance of the money stolen by Langhorne was money for unclaimed strays, and which money would eventually have been turned over to the stock inspector and detective fund for its credit.

Anyone, by referring to the amount of stray money which reverted to the stock inspector and detective fund during the past year, can easily see that the money taken by Langhorne was practically all money the owners of which could not have been located. To prove this statement, I refer you to the amount of money turned over to the stock inspector and detective fund in 1911, which was for unclaimed strays of 1909. This amounts to about 3,800.00. The money turned over in 1912 for unclaimed strays of 1910 amounts to a little over \$8,000.00.

The Investigating Committee has signified its intention of making another report. I hope that the matters that I have referred to above will be mentioned in this final report, and I also hope the committee will signify its intention of taking some action to finally dispose of the Langhorne case.







81-5-112. Permit system for transportation of sheep –penalty (went into effect Jan. 1990).

(1) The department shall adopt rules imposing a permit system for the transportation of sheep within or out of the state if it finds that a permit system is necessary to prevent theft of sheep. The rules must establish fees commensurate with the department's cost of operating the permit system.

(2) A person who purposely or knowingly transports sheep in violation of rules adopted under subsection (1) is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding 6 months, or both.




