



Montana Safety Culture Act Evaluation

Enacted in 1993, the Montana Safety Culture Act (MSCA) requires that all employers establish an educational based safety program and a comprehensive safety and health program. A brief review of the inspectors' observations for each employer requirement under the MSCA is listed below:

All Employers

1. Provide each new employee with a general safety orientation containing information common to all employees and appropriate to the business operations, before they begin their regular job duties.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory provides new employees with a general safety orientation.
2. Provide job or task-specific safety training appropriate for employees before they perform that job or task without direct supervision.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory conducts task-specific training on Standard Operating Procedures. However, documentation was not provided.
3. Offer continuing regular refresher safety training.
 - Although it is noted that the Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory has offered First Aid/ CPR training in the past documentation for current refresher training was not provided.
4. Provide a system for the employer and their employees to develop an awareness and appreciation of safety through tools such as newsletters, periodic safety meetings, posters, and safety incentive programs.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory has a system in place to develop awareness and appreciation of safety that includes periodic safety meetings.

5. Provide periodic self-inspection for hazard assessment when the safety program is implemented, new worksites are established, and thereafter as is appropriate to the business operations, but at least annually.
 - Although it is noted that the Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory has conducted documented self-inspections of the laboratory in the past, documentation for current periodic self-inspection was not provided.
6. Include documentation of performance of activities listed in (1) through (5) above. Keep the documentation for three years.
 - With the exception of new employee general safety orientation and periodic safety meetings, documentation is not maintained for the above elements.

Additional Requirements for Employers with More Than 5 Employees

1. Develop and implement policies and procedures that assign specific safety responsibilities and safety performance accountability.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory did not provide documentation of a safety policy which highlights the safety responsibilities for employees and members of management.
 2. Develop and implement procedures for reporting, investigating, and taking corrective action on all work-related incidents, accidents, injuries, illnesses and known unsafe work conditions or practices.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory did not provide documentation of procedures in place for incident reporting and investigation.
 3. Have a safety committee in place, which complies with the requirements of the MSCA.
 - The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory did not provide documentation of an active safety committee in place.

Safety Culture Summary

The Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory is not fully compliant with the requirements of the Montana Safety Culture Act (MSCA). Task-specific training on Standard Operating Procedures is conducted. However, documentation was not provided. Also, documentation for current refresher training was not provided and self-inspections for the Bozeman Lab are not conducted at least annually. Furthermore, documentation of a safety policy which highlights the safety responsibilities for employees and members of management and incident reporting procedures was not provided at time of inspection and an active safety committee is not in place. Despite these deficiencies, the Bozeman Laboratory provides new employees with a general safety orientation upon hire and has an awareness and appreciation for safety through periodic safety meetings. We recommend that the Department of Livestock Bozeman Laboratory work with the Montana Department of Labor & Industry Consultation Services to become compliant with the MSCA.



Item Number 1 :


Standard: ARM 24.30.102: 29 CFR 1910.305(g)(1)(iv)(A). Unless specifically permitted otherwise in paragraph (g)(1)(ii) of this section, flexible cords and cables may not be used as a substitute for the fixed wiring of a structure.

Condition: Observed several flexible cords used as permanent wiring throughout the laboratories.




Milk Lab: Cord for Incubator




Milk Lab: Cord for Cow Lights

Pathologist Office: Cord for Computer




PCR Area

Item Number: 2

Standard: ARM 24.30.102: 29 CFR 1910.303(g)(2)(i). Except as elsewhere required or permitted by this standard, live parts of electrical equipment operating at 50 volts or more shall be guarded against accidental contact by use of approved cabinets or other forms of approved enclosure.

Condition: Energized electrical wires were exposed in the PCR Area.

Recommended Action: Have an electrician remove/cover the exposed wires to prevent accidental contact.



Item Number: 3

Standard: ARM 24.30.102: 29 CFR 1910.134(c). "Respiratory Protection Program" This paragraph requires the employer to develop and implement a written respiratory protection program with required worksite- specific procedures and elements for required respirator use. The program must be administered by a suitably trained program administrator. In addition, certain program elements may be voluntary use to prevent potential hazards associated with the use of the respirator.

Condition: Respirators were found in the labs. It was explained that respirators are used by employees who are sensitive to formalin. The department does not have a respiratory protection program in place.

Recommended Action: When respirators are utilized, the employer must develop a respirator program. This program must include medical evaluations, fit testing requirements, and the appropriate training (selection, use, and maintenance) that must be conducted prior to respirator use. All above elements must be documented.





Other than Serious Violations

Item Number: 4

Standard: ARM 24.30.102; 29 CFR 1910.303(g)(1). Sufficient access and working space shall be provided and maintained about all electric equipment to permit ready & safe operation and maintenance of such equipment.

Condition: Observed electrical breaker panels and disconnect switches throughout the labs with blocked access.

Recommended Action: Remove items from these areas to provide sufficient access and working space to the panels and switches. Best practice is to tape or paint a 3' area in front of electrical panels.




Item Number: 5

Standard: ARM 24.30.102: MCA 50-71-116. An employer must provide a place of employment free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious physical harm.

Condition: Flammable liquids were stored outside of an approved storage container/cabinet.

Recommended Action: Store all flammable liquids in an approved container/cabinet when not in use. A metal locker can be used as a storage cabinet.



Item Number: 6

Standard: ARM 24.30.102; 29 CFR 1910.22(d)(1). In every building or other structure, or part thereof, used for mercantile, business, industrial, or storage purposes, the loads approved by the building official shall be marked on plates of approved design which shall be supplied and securely affixed by the owner of the building, or his duly authorized agent, in a conspicuous place in each space to which they relate. Such plates shall not be removed or defaced but, if lost, removed, or defaced, shall be replaced by the owner or his agent.

Condition: The overhead storage area in the Ante Room did not have the maximum load rating posted.

Recommended Action: Identify and clearly label the load rating for the overhead storage.




Item Number: 7

Standard: ARM 24.30.102; 29 CFR 1910.305(g)(2)(iii). Flexible cords and cables shall be connected to devices and fittings so that strain relief is provided that will prevent pull form being directly transmitted to joints or terminal screws.

Condition: Observed a power cord to the plate reader in the Milk Lab and an extension cord in the closet of the Preparation Room with exposed inner conductors due to the outer jackets being pulled from the plugs.

Recommended Action: Remove the cords and accompanying equipment from service until the cords can be properly repaired or replaced.



Item Number: 8

Standard: ARM 24.30.102; 29 CFR 1910.305(g)(1)(iv)(C). Unless specifically permitted otherwise in paragraph (g)(1)(ii) of this section, flexible cords and cables may not be used where run through doorways, windows, or similar openings.

Condition: Observed an electrical cord running through a doorway in the Milk Lab.

Recommended Action: Have an electrician install an outlet on the other side of the door or remove or relocate the lights.



REASONABLE NECESSITY STATEMENT:

August 21, 2014, (9CFR 381.66, 381.65)

9 CFR 381.66 Temperature and Chilling and Freezing procedures)

This section revises the definition for “air chill” to allow an antimicrobial intervention to be applied with water to poultry at the beginning of the chilling process if its use does not result in any net pick-up of water or moisture during the chilling process. The initial antimicrobial intervention may result in some temperature reduction of the product if the majority of temperature removal is accomplished exclusively by chilled air.

9 CFR 381.65 Operations and Procedures, Generally

This section identifies procedures for controlling contamination throughout the poultry slaughter process. In addition, it requires that official poultry establishments develop, implement and maintain written procedures to prevent contamination of carcasses and parts by enteric pathogens and fecal contamination throughout the entire slaughter and dressing operation. Further requires larger establishments to collect samples to analyze for microbial organisms at specified rates.

In addition, official poultry establishments must maintain daily records to document the implementation and monitoring of the procedures of controlling contamination. Data may be maintained electronically if the establishment has controls to maintain data integrity. Records must be maintained for at least one year and must be accessible to FSIS. Montana currently does not have any poultry establishments of this size.

June 19, 2015 (9 CFR 430.4 Control of Lm in RTE Meat and Poultry)

FSIS is clarifying in the regulations that establishments may not release into commerce product that has been in contact with *Listeria monocytogenes* (*Lm*)-contaminated surfaces without reprocessing the product. In addition, FSIS is removing the requirement for establishments to report production volume and related information to FSIS because the Agency now routinely collects this information through its Public Health Information System (PHIS).

When the regulations came out, the effective date was noted as June 19, 2015 rather than September 17, 2015 as published in the Federal Register in anticipation of comments. This change is only to correct this date to accurately reflect the effective date listed in the Code of Federal Regulations.

January 1, 2016 (9 CFR 317.2, 381.117 Descriptive Designation for Added Solutions)

A product name for a raw meat or poultry product that does not meet a standard of identity must contain a descriptive designation that includes the percentage of added solution and the common name of all individual ingredients listed in descending order of predominance.

May 17, 2016 (9 CFR 317.2 Descriptive Designation for Tenderized Beef)

The product name for a mechanically tenderized beef must contain a descriptive designation that the product is mechanically tenderized, needle tenderized, or blade tenderized. Further, the labels of raw or partially cooked needle or blade tenderized raw beef products for household consumers, hotels, restaurants, or similar institutions, must bear validated cooking instructions.

June 20, 2016 (9 CFR 320.1, 320.2, 320.3)

9 CFR 320.1 Records to be Kept

Requires records of official establishments and retail stores that grind raw beef products for sale in commerce maintain the following records:

- Establishment numbers of establishments supplying material used to prepare each lot of raw ground beef products
- All supplier lot numbers and production dates
- Names of the supplied materials including beef components and any materials carried over from one production lot to the next
- The date and time each lot of raw ground beef product is produced
- Date and time when grinding equipment and other related food contact surfaces are cleaned and sanitized

9 CFR 320.2 Place of Maintenance of Records.

Requires records to be maintained at the place where business is conducted with one exception. The exception is that if business is conducted at multiple locations, the records may be maintained at the headquarters office.

9 CFR 320.3 Record Retention Period

Specifies that records required must be kept for two years following December 31 of the year in which the beef was ground.

4. Concerned persons may submit their data, views, or arguments in writing concerning the proposed action to the Executive Officer, Department of Livestock, 301 N. Roberts St., Room 308, P.O. Box 202001, Helena, MT 59620-2001, by faxing to (406) 444-1929, or by e-mailing to MDOLcomments@mt.gov to be received no later than 5:00 p.m., September 30, 2016.

5. If persons who are directly affected by the proposed action wish to express their data, views, or arguments orally or in writing at a public hearing, they must make a written request for a hearing and submit this request along with any written comments they have to the same address as above. The written request for hearing must be received no later than 5:00 p.m., September 30, 2016.

6. If the department receives requests for a public hearing on the proposed action from either 10 percent or 25, whichever is less, of the establishments who are directly affected by the proposed action; from the appropriate administrative rule review committee of the Legislature; from a governmental subdivision or agency; or from an association having not less than 25 members who will be directly affected, a public hearing will be held at a later date. Notice of the public hearing will be published in the Montana Administrative Register. Ten percent of those directly affected has been determined to be 4 establishments, based upon there being approximately 40 establishments relating to animal feeding, slaughter, and disposal.

7. The Department of Livestock maintains lists of interested persons who wish to receive notices of rulemaking actions proposed by this agency. Persons who wish to have their name added to the list shall make a written request that includes the name, e-mail, and mailing address of the person to receive notices and specifies for which program the person wishes to receive notices. Notices will be sent by e-mail unless a mailing preference is noted in the request. Such written request may be mailed or delivered to the contact person in 4 above or may be made by completing a request form at any rules hearing held by the department.

8. An electronic copy of this proposal notice is available through the Secretary of State's web site at <http://sos.mt.gov/ARM/Register>. The Secretary of State strives to make the electronic copy of this notice conform to the official version of the notice, as printed in the Montana Administrative Register, but advises all concerned persons that in the event of a discrepancy between the official printed text of the notice and the electronic version of the notice, only the official printed text will be considered. In addition, although the Secretary of State works to keep its web site accessible at all times, concerned persons should be aware that the web site may be unavailable during some periods, due to system maintenance or technical problems.

10. With regard to the requirements of 2-4-111, MCA, the department has determined that the amendment of the above-referenced rule will not significantly and directly impact small businesses.
