





Licensing Action Final Oder

Background Info:

The Department sought revocation of Robert Sain d/b/a A-S Processing's custom exempt meat establishment license, and a MAPA contested case hearing was held before a hearing examiner on February 6, 2025. The hearing examiner has issued a proposed decision that both the licensee and the Department filed exceptions to. The Board must consider the materials and review the proposed decision for entry of a final order.

This matter came before the Board at the June 27, 2025 meeting, and the Board voted to defer decision. The Department believes this matter is ready for reconsideration by the Board at the August 13, 2025 meeting, and the Department again requests entry of a final order revoking the license.

Recommendation:

The Department has retained separate counsel, Michael Kauffman and Patricia Klanke of the Drake Law Firm, P.C., to advise the Board on this matter. The security interest brands liens renewal began in January 2023. Brands liens are amortized from January 2023 to December 2027. Security Interest Filing Fee revenue will be low at the beginning of the five year cycle and will increase from year to year.

The monthly rate of return on STIP investments was 4.36% and 5.37% for June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively. As of June 30, the fiscal year-to-date avereage rate of return for fiscal year 2025 and 2024 was 4.71% and 5.38%, respectively. The Department's STIP balance in all funds as of June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024 was \$23,241,933 and \$23,609,492, respectively or \$367,559 less than last year. This includes the Proprietary STIP balance of \$586,005.

^{**} Donations to the Volunteer Wolf Donation fund for the current fiscal year as of June 30, 2025 is \$133,469 or \$8,105 more than the same period last year. The total amount of donations received from inception of the voluntary wolf donation program is \$616,325 as of June 30, 2025. The Department has transferred \$482,997 of the voluntary wolf donations to Wild Life Services for predator control since the beginning of the program.

The Department of Livestock is budgeted for \$18,004,890 and 142.62 FTE in FY 2025. Personal services budget is 98% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 was \$915,038 higher than June 2024. Operations are 100% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 were \$1,011,660 higher than June 2024. Overall, Department of Livestock total expenditures were \$1,818,993 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, 99% of the department's budget has been expended.

If an agency has leftover budget authority at year end, it can carryforward 30% of the excess HB02 authority to be used in the following two fiscal years. In FY 2023, the Department had \$227,017 of carryforward authority, \$62,988 general fund, \$125,825 state special revenue and \$38,204 federal special revenue. The Department utilized all of the FY 2023 carryforward authority.

The Department had employee termination payouts of \$483,517 and \$350,368 for the period ending June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively.

STATUTORY APPROPRIATED, BUDGET AMENDED AND HOUSEBILL 10 NOTES

NOTES TO THE BUDGETARY EXPENSES COMPARISON REPORT FOR STATUATORY APPROPRIATIONS, BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND HOUSE BILL 10

Predator animal control is funded with a transfer of per capita fees monies to the fund. The department has paid three counties \$41,290 and Wildlife Services \$523,710. The three counties do not have a cooperative agreement with Wildlife Services for predator control.

The Livestock Loss Board is statutorily budgeted with \$300,000 for livestock depredation loss remediation. From the total amount budgeted for depredation claims of \$450,000 in House Bill 02 and Statuatory Appropriations, LLB has expended \$275,695 or 61% of the total depredation claims budgets, account 67200. In FY 2024, LLB paid \$194,635 for depredation claims as of June 30, 2024 or \$81,060 less than the current year.

The Livestock Loss Board is statutorily budgeted with \$244,000 for livestock depredation reductions grants. As of June 30, 2025 the Board has spend \$126,730 on livestock depredations reductions grants in FY 2025.

The Wolf Mitigation Donations fund is funded with donations, mostly from hunters and anglers, while purchasing hunting and fishing licenses. The Department collected \$125,364 and \$114,370 in FY 2024 and FY 2023, respectively, and paid those amounts to Wildlife Services in FY 2025 and FY 2024, respectively. The Department has an MOU with Wildlife Services for the monitoring and removal of wolves.

Housebill 10 authority is for new information technology projects. The 2023 legislation approved HB10 authority for \$1,000,000 of per capita fee for software development. The Department expended \$375,000 in FY 2024. While there is no end date to HB10 authority, DOA monitors the progress of IT projects to ensure that agencies are developing the projects in a timely manner. The department requests authority as needed to pay for work peformed on the software development. As of June 30, 2025, the department has requested an additional \$575,000 in HB10 budget authority in FY 2025 and has spent \$179,848 of the requested FY 2025 HB10 authority. Department has two HB10 projects currently in process. There is \$425,000 budgeted for the Animal Health System Replacement and \$125,000 for the Brands Snowflake system.

81-2-203 MCA created a stuatory indemnity special revenue fund for compensation of animals for slaughter due to disease under the direction of the Department as per 81-2-201 MCA. The Department may transfer \$10,000 per year to the fund. Unspent monies are carried forward to subsequent years until the fund accumulates \$100,000 of transferred funds. Payments are limited to the cash balance in the fund after the annual transfer. The Department has paid \$5,850 as of June 30, 2025 for indemnity payments since inception of 81-2-203 MCA. There is a cash balance in the indemnity fund of \$14,601 as of June 30, 2025. The cash is invested in STIP has earned \$453 in interest since the fund was created.

The Department has five federal milk inspection grants. The first grant was awarded in FY 2024 and is for milk inspection training and supplies in the amount of \$12,613. The Department spent \$5,454 in FY 2024. \$7,159 of the unspent authority was carried over to FY 2025. The second is for milk inspection tools and equipment in the amount of \$8,308. The Department has spent \$7,737 of the equipment grant. The third federal grant is for milk testing equipment for the diagnostic laboratory. The amount of the grant is \$40,969. The fourth federal grant is for milk inspection for High Path Avian Infuenza testing personal protection equipment. The amount of the grant is \$15,224. The fifth federal grant is for two milk inspectors to attend training at two out of state training seminars and for one milk inspection employee to attend two out of state conferences. The amount of the grant is \$14,589.

The Meat & Poultry budget amendment in FY 2024 was to increase the budget to match the federal funding the Department received in the federal fiscal year 2023 which ended September 30, 2023. The BA was spent on normal operting expenses. The current fiscal year budget has been deemed adequate for the antipated federal funding that will be received in the federal fiscal year 2024 which ends September 30, 2025.

The Department received a federal grant for Swine Health Improvement Program (SHIP) training. This is a \$10,000 grant with an expiration date of March 31, 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$5,491 of the SHIP funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Foreign Animal Disease Breakout Prepardness (FADBP) training. This is a \$88,567 grant with an expiration date of May 26, 2026. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$10,389 of the FADBP funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Cronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Management of Alternative Livestock herds. This is a \$205,616 grant with an expiration date of June 30, 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$205,616 of the CWD funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in Livestock Response, Control, and Surveillance in milk. This grant is to test, monitor and communicate HPAI milk results. The amount of the grant is \$1,030.

In FY 2024, the Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$256,300 from the National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) through USDA, APHIS of which \$\$22,414 was spent in FY 2024. \$233,886 was carried forward to FY 2025. This grant is to purchase testing supplies, travel, maintenance contracts and laboratory equipment for the Diagnostic Laboratory. As of June 30, 2025, the lab has spent \$184,506 in FY 2025 of the NAHLN grant. MVDL has until May 31, 2025 to spend the grant funding.

The Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$170,950 from the National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) through USDA, APHIS. The grant is a passthrough grant in which MVDL is administering. It is for improvement of the lab's LIMS system which will be implemented by six states including Montana. The grant will pay for the implentation for the other five states. MVDL has until June 30, 2026 to spend the grant funding.

The Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$1,000,000 from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) through USDA, APHIS. This grant is a sub-award through the Colorado State University. This grant is to purchase equipment for the Diagnostic Laboratory including the incinerator for the new lab building. As of June 30, 2025, the lab has spent \$557,629 of the APHIS ARP grant. MVDL has until May 31, 2025 to spend the grant funding.

The Animal Health Bureau receives federal funding for animal disease traceability. Unspent federal money at State Fiscal Year (SFY) end is carried over to the next SFY. The Department received \$99,214 from APHIS USDA for animal disease traceability expenses. The Department spent \$16,362 of the grant in FY 2024. Federal grants carried over from SFY 2024 to SFY 2025 was \$82,852. As of June 30, 2025, the Department expended \$99,214 or 100% of the grant.

Central Services And Board Of Livestock is budgeted \$2,081,376 and 14.00 FTE in FY 2025 and is funded with per capita fees. Personal services budget is 100% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. The personal services expended through June 2025 was \$206,483 higher than June 2024. Operating expenses are 93% expended as of June 2025 and were \$46,234 lower than June 2024. Overall, CSD total expenditures were \$166,307 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, CSD has expended 98% of the its budget.

Predator animal control is funded with a transfer of per capita fees monies to the fund. The department has paid three counties \$41,290 and Wildlife Services \$523,710. The three counties do not have a cooperative agreement with Wildlife Services for predator control.

The Wolf Mitigation Donations fund is funded with donations, mostly from hunters and anglers, while purchasing hunting and fishing licenses. The Department collected \$125,364 and \$114,370 in FY 2024 and FY 2023, respectively, and paid those amounts to Wildlife Services in FY 2025 and FY 2024, respectivley. The Department has an MOU with Wildlife Services for the monitoring and removal of wolves.

Housebill 10 authority is for new information technology projects. The 2023 legislation approved HB10 authority for \$1,000,000 of per capita fee for software development. The Department expended \$375,000 in FY 2024. While there is no end date to HB10 authority, DOA monitors the progress of IT projects to ensure that agencies are developing the projects in a timely manner. The department requests authority as needed to pay for work peformed on the software development. As of June 30, 2025, the department has requested an additional \$575,000 in HB10 budget authority in FY 2025 and has spent \$179,848 of the requested FY 2025 HB10 authority. Department has two HB10 projects currently in process. There is \$425,000 budgeted for the Animal Health System Replacement and \$125,000 for the Brands Snowflake system.

In FY 2025, the Livestock Loss Board is budgeted \$302,589 with 1.00 FTE funded with general fund. This includes \$150,000 of funding for depredation remediation claims. The personal services budget is 75% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 was \$29,059 lower than June 2024. Operations are 22% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 were \$9,726 lower than June 2024. In FY 2023, the Board did not have HB02 budget authority for deprediation claims. As of June 30, 2025, the board has spent 100% of its HB02 depredation claims budget. LLB began paying livestock depredation claims from the statutory appropriations budget in April 2024. Overall, Livestock Loss Board total expenditures were \$38,785 lower than the same period last year, of which \$150,000 was from newly appriated HB02 funding for depredation claims. As of June 30, 2025, LLB has expended 80% of the its budget.

The Livestock Loss Board is statutorily budgeted with \$300,000 for livestock depredation loss remediation. From the total amount budgeted for depredation claims of \$450,000 in House Bill 02 and Statuatory Appropriations, LLB has expended \$275,695 or 61% of the total depredation claims budgets, account 67200. In FY 2024, LLB paid \$194,635 for depredation claims as of June 30, 2024 or \$81,060 less than the current year.

Statuatory appropriated funds will allow available cash to be spent within for that program. LLB had additional cash available for the livestock loss reduction grants and cooperative work with Wild Life Services. Budget in fund 02125 Livestock Loss Reductions was increased by \$144,000.

The Livestock Loss Board is statutorily budgeted with \$244,000 for livestock depredation reductions grants. As of June 30, 2025 the Board has spend \$126,730 on livestock depredations reductions grants in FY 2025.

The Livestock Loss Board had employee termination payouts of \$26,585 for the period ending June 30, 2025.

Per 81-1-112, the Livestock Loss Board is to transfer cash balances over \$300,000 from the loss remediation fund to the loss reduction fund. From this transfer, the Livestock Loss Board can give up to 50% of the amount transferred to Wild Life Services and may use up to 10% of the amount transferred for the bureau's operating expenses. 50% of the amount transferred must be used for loss reduction grants.

The amount transferred from the loss remediation fund to the loss reduction fund was \$190,204. The Livestock Loss Board can award Wild Life Services up to \$95,103.

As of July 18, 2025, the Livestock Loss Board has a cash balance of \$495,938 in the Livestock Loss Reduction fund. This includes the FY 2026 transfer of \$100,000 per 15-1-122(3) MCA. If the Livestock Loss Board awards Wild Life Services \$95,103, there will be \$396,630 available for loss reduction grants in FY 2026.

The Livestock Loss Board has \$86,892 available in its license plate donation fund.

In FY 2025, The Milk Control Bureau is budgeted \$227,185 and has 2.00 FTE. The bureau is funded with milk industry fees. The personal services budget is 97% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 were \$32,790 higher than June 2024. Operations are 62% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 were \$3,343 lower than June 2024. Overall, Milk Control Bureau total expenditures were \$29,447 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, the Milk Control Bureau has expended 93% of its budget.

The State Veteriniarn Office includes Import and Alternative Livestock. In FY 2025, the State Veterinarian Import Office is budgeted with \$1,227,474 of per capita fees and \$7,655 of animal health fees. The personal services budget is 98% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 was \$137,489 higher than June 2024. Operations are 100% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 30, 2025 were \$328,765 higher than June 29, 2024. Animal Health has spent \$516,254 more than the same period in FY 2024. As of June 30, 2025 the Animal Health Import Office has expended 99% of its budget.

The import office sells some supplies at cost to veterinarians. The income is in the Animal Health Fees.

The budget includes one time only funding for a pickup in the amount of \$50,000.

The 62200 Supply row is \$276,000 higher than the prior year because the Board directed the AH Bureau to purchase backup supply of identification tags during the April 2025 board meeting to meet the short supply from USDA. The Department transferred excess authority from the Milk Inspection and Egg Grading Bureaus to make this purchase.

The Animal Health Import Office had employee termination payouts of \$6,087 and \$32,062 for the period ending June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively.

81-2-203 MCA created a stuatory indemnity special revenue fund for compensation of animals for slaughter due to disease under the direction of the Department as per 81-2-201 MCA. The Department may transfer \$10,000 per year to the fund. Unspent monies are carried forward to subsequent years until the fund accumulates \$100,000 of transferred funds. Payments are limited to the cash balance in the fund after the annual transfer. The Department has paid \$5,850 as of June 30, 2025 for indemnity payments since inception of 81-2-203 MCA. There is a cash balance in the indemnity fund of \$14,601 as of June 30, 2025. The cash is invested in STIP has earned \$453 in interest since the fund was created.

The Designated Surveillance Area (DSA) is budgeted for \$958,122 and 2.00 FTE in FY 2025 and is funded with General Funds. The Federal Umbrella is budgeted for \$885,138 and 3.50 FTE in SFY 2025 and is funded with Federal Funds. Of the \$885,138 Federal Umbrella budgeted, only \$658,107 has been awarded to the Department for the Federal Fiscal Year 2024 (FFY24) which ends March 31, 2025. The Federal Umbrella FFY25 authority is for the upcoming federal grant starting April 1, 2025. This grant has not been awarded at this time.

The personal services budget is 97% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 was \$62,567 higher than June 2024. Operations are 102% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 were \$69,440 higher than June 2024. Overall, total expenditures were \$129,827 higher than the same period last year with 99% of the budget expended.

The Department received a federal grant for Swine Health Improvement Program (SHIP) training. This is a \$10,000 grant with an expiration date of March 31, 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$5,491 of the SHIP funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Foreign Animal Disease Breakout Prepardness (FADBP) training. This is a \$88,567 grant with an expiration date of May 26, 2026. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$10,389 of the FADBP funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Cronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Management of Alternative Livestock herds. This is a \$205,616 grant with an expiration date of June 30, 2025. As of June 30, 2025, the Department has spent \$205,616 of the CWD funding.

The Department received a federal grant for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in Livestock Response, Control, and Surveillance in milk. This grant is to test, monitor and communicate HPAI milk results. The amount of the grant is \$1,030.

The Animal Health Bureau receives federal funding for animal disease traceability. Unspent federal money at State Fiscal Year (SFY) end is carried over to the next SFY. The Department received \$99,214 from APHIS USDA for animal disease traceability expenses. The Department spent \$16,362 of the grant in FY 2024. Federal grants carried over from SFY 2024 to SFY 2025 was \$82,852. As of June 30, 2025, the Department expended \$99,214 or 100% of the grant.

The diagnostic laboratory is budgeted for \$3,708,941 and 22 FTE in FY 2025. It is funded with general fund of \$1,385,721, per capita fees of \$931,589, federal funds of \$21,729, and lab testing fees of \$1,369,902. Personal services are 99% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 were \$118,319 higher than June 2024. Operations are 100% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 were \$287,116 higher than June 2024. Overall, Diagnostic Laboratory total expenditures were \$313,272 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, the Diagnositc Lab has expended 99% of its budget.

In FY 2024, the Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$256,300 from the National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) through USDA, APHIS of which \$\$22,414 was spent in FY 2024. \$233,886 was carried forward to FY 2025. This grant is to purchase testing supplies, travel, maintenance contracts and laboratory equipment for the Diagnostic Laboratory. As of June 30, 2025, the lab has spent \$184,506 in FY 2025 of the NAHLN grant. MVDL has until May 31, 2025 to spend the grant funding.

The Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$170,950 from the National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) through USDA, APHIS. The grant is a passthrough grant in which MVDL is administering. It is for improvement of the lab's LIMS system which will be implemented by six states including Montana. The grant will pay for the implentation for the other five states. MVDL has until June 30, 2026 to spend the grant funding.

The Diagnostic Laboratory was awarded \$1,000,000 from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) through USDA, APHIS. This grant is a sub-award through the Colorado State University. This grant is to purchase equipment for the Diagnostic Laboratory including the incinerator for the new lab building. As of June 30, 2025, the lab has spent \$557,629 of the APHIS ARP grant. MVDL has until May 31, 2025 to spend the grant funding.

The Diagnostic Lab program had employee termination payouts of \$2,203 and \$13,649 for the period ending June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively.

The total Milk & Egg program is budgeted \$614,790 with 6.75 FTE in FY 2025 funded with milk inspection fees, egg grading fees and federal shell egg inspection fees. The personal services budget is 97% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 2025 was \$2,696 lower than June 2024. Operation expense budget is 92% expended with 100% of budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 2025 was \$36,104 higher than June 2024. The Animal Health Division total expenditures were \$33.408 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, the Milk & Fgg program has expended The Department has five federal milk inspection grants. The first grant was awarded in FY 2024 and is for milk inspection training and supplies in the amount of \$12,613. The Department spent \$5,454 in FY 2024. \$7,159 of the unspent authority was carried over to FY 2025. The second is for milk inspection tools and equipment in the amount of \$8,308. The Department has spent \$7,737 of the equipment grant. The third federal grant is for milk testing equipment for the diagnostic laboratory. The amount of the grant is \$40,969. In FY 2025, Meat Inspection is budgeted \$2,846,814 with 28.50 FTE. The bureau is funded with general fund of \$1,600,535, federal meat & poultry inspection funds of \$1,236,704 and \$9,575 of animal health fees levied from licensing as per 81-9-201(1)MCA. Personal services budget is 100% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June FY 2025 was \$171,802 higher than June FY 2024. Operations are 97% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Including the BA authority, overall operating expenses as of June FY 2025 were \$37,537 higher than June FY 2024. Overall, Meat Inspection total expenditures were \$209,339 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025 the Meat Inspection program expended 99% of its budget.

The Meat & Poultry budget amendment in FY 2024 was to increase the budget to match the federal funding the Department received in the federal fiscal year 2023 which ended September 30, 2023. The BA was spent on normal operting expenses. The current fiscal year budget has been deemed adequate for the antipated federal funding that will be recieved in the federal fiscal year 2024 which ends September 30, 2025.

The Meat & Poultry Inspection program had employee termination payouts of \$52,416 and \$32,291 for the period ending June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively.

In FY 2025, Brands Enforcement is budgeted for \$5,138,724 with 54.61 FTE. It is funded with brand inspection fees of \$3,647,336 and per capita fees of \$1,491,388. Personal services budget is 97% expended with 100% of payrolls complete. Personal services expended as of June 30, 2025 was \$217,343 higher than June 29, 2024. Operations are 110% expended with 100% of the budget year lapsed. Operation expenses as of June 30, 2025 were \$213,719 higher than June 29,2024. Overall, Brands Enforcement total expenditures were \$361,642 higher than the same period last year. As of June 30, 2025, the Brands Division has expended 100% of its budget.

The department adjusted the standard budget between accounts. The adjustments are within the department's authority and does not need OBPP approval since there were no changes between account types (ei, no authority changes from personal services to operations).

The budget includes one-time-only funding for trailers, safety equipment and radios in the amount of \$53,857 funded with brand inspection fees with \$25,889 for minor equipment and \$27,968 for equipment. As of June 30, 2025, the department has spent \$53,857 of the one-time-only authority on radios and trailers.

The Brands Enforcement division had employee termination payouts of \$152,206 and \$209,703 for the period ending June 30, 2025 and June 30, 2024, respectively.

Background Info: Since the last BOL meeting, 20 claims for a total of 25 losses have come across the desk. All were for calendar year 2025.

Actions from the July 28th LLB Meeting: 1) Approved part-time program specialist job description; 2) Awarded 13 prevention grants, totaling \$216,335; and 3) Authorized \$95,103 to be transferred to USDA Wildlife Services.

Agenda Item: Indemnity Request-Beaverhead County Brucellosis Reactor

Background Info: A 5-year-old bull from Beaverhead County was euthanized due to a non-negative brucellosis test. The bull had failed his annual breeding soundness exam and was sold at the Dillon Livestock Sale on Thursday July 24th. A second brucellosis test was performed on July 25th to confirm the non-negative results while the bull was still at the stockyards. As a result of the non-negative tests, the bull was euthanized on July 30th and sent to the Veterinary Diagnostic lab in Bozeman for tissue collection for further brucellosis testing. There is no federal indemnity for animals euthanized due to non-negative brucellosis tests. USDA will pay \$250 dollars for the diagnostic purchase of the animal, which results in a significant loss to the producer. This loss has been a consistent frustration of the program. With the recent legislation that allows MDOL to maintain and pay indemnity for animals destroyed due to program diseases, animal health is requesting the board to consider paying indemnity to better match the value of the animal. Sales receipt on the 24th for sale to slaughter place a value for the animal at roughly 4,000 dollars.

Examples will be provided for consideration in determining this animal's value including a USDA indemnity calculator result and comparable market sales.

Background Info: 2-3 veterinarians to attend the United States Animal Health Association (USAHA) October 30- Nov 5 in Aurora, Colorado. USAHA is the primary meeting for state and federal animal health officials where recommendations are made on animal health policies. Additionally, attendance at committee meetings provides Montana personnel with current information on disease incidence, management, and epidemiological investigations. USAHA provides a unique forum where resolutions are debated and passed that can affect the state of Montana's livestock commerce. Sending multiple veterinarians for staggered time frames allows networking, attendance at concurrent committee meetings, and an opportunity to have a voice on behalf of Montana producers. Dr. Szymanski typically attends the meeting for 7 full days. The assistant state veterinarian would tentatively attend for 5 days, and the program veterinarian for 3 full days.

The approximate cost is \$2000-3500 per attendee, paid by CA, and DSA- General Fund.
