NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

MAR NOTICE NO. 2025-18.1

Summary

Amendment of ARM 32.3.435 pertaining to testing within the DSA

No Hearing Scheduled

If the agency receives requests for a public hearing on the proposed rulemaking from either 10 percent or 25, whichever is less, of the persons directly affected by the proposed rulemaking; from the appropriate administrative rule review committee of the Legislature; from a governmental subdivision or agency; or from an association having not less than 25 members who will be directly affected, a hearing will be held at a later date. Notice of the hearing will be published in the Montana Administrative Register.

The estimated number of persons directly affected by the proposed rulemaking is 450.

If persons who are directly affected by the proposed action wish to express their data, views, or arguments orally or in writing at a public hearing, they must make written request for a hearing in writing to the contact information listed below. Rulemaking Actions

AMEND

The rule proposed to be amended is as follows, stricken matter interlined, new matter underlined:

32.3.435 TESTING WITHIN THE DSA

- (1) Cattle or domestic bison located within the DSA must have an official brucellosis test within 30 days prior to leaving the DSA or changing ownership, except:
 - (a) steers or spayed heifers-;
 - (b) sexually intact animals less than 12 months of age for feeding-;
 - (c) animals moving to an approved Montana livestock market that will be tested at the market prior to sale-;
 - (d) animals destined for exhibition or veterinary care within the DSA that will not be commingled with other livestock, will remain in confinement for the duration of the event/treatment, and will depart within 10 days of arrival-; or
 - (e) animals utilizing the DSA during the low-risk period (entering the DSA after July 15 and leaving prior to February January 15).
- (2) A <u>The test required in (1) must be completed within 30 days prior to leaving the</u> <u>DSA, except that a</u> test completed July <u>August</u> 16 or after is acceptable for movement out of the DSA or change of ownership through February 15 of the following year.

(3) and (4) remain the same.

Reasonable Necessity Statement

The department proposes to amend the above-stated rule to correct a previous rule change that failed to accurately list the low-risk period for wildlife spillover transmission of brucellosis to livestock within the Designated Surveillance Area (DSA). The extended test validity period is 30 days later than the low-risk period, and thus the amendment corrects that date range as well.

Small Business Impact

Pursuant to 2-4-111, MCA, the agency has determined that the rule changes proposed in this notice will not have a significant and direct impact upon small businesses.

Bill Sponsor Notification

The bill sponsor contact requirements of 2-4-302, MCA, do not apply.
